Google Analytics Campaign Tagging Guide



Guidelines

Standardized and consistent tag names make future analysis easier and more effective. For non-digital campaigns, tracking is also possible, either by including utm parameters inside a redirect url (e.g. **goo.gl**) or by directing visits to a specific landing page (e.g. mysite.com/freeshipping).

- **Don't use spaces** (e.g.: october newsletter not October Newsletter)
- Don't use punctuation and/or uppercase letters (e.g.: october_newsletter not October Newsletter. and new promo not New Promo!)
- Don't use source as campaign description
- Don't create new mediums or include medium in the campaign name
- Don't manually tag campaigns on Google Search/Network. Enable auto-tagging

utm_campaign - Campaign name should be consistent across all tagging. Use lowercase and underscore to separate words (e.g. fortune 100).

utm_medium - Medium is the channel through which the visitor arrived to your site; email, display, social, paid_social, cpc, sms, radio or printad. Note cpc is reserved for Paid Search. If auto-tagging is enabled you shouldn't add campaign tagging to Google AdWords.

utm_source - Source is where the visitor was sent from (e.g. site name: retailmenot for www.retailmenot.com or a database name: **customers** for email or sms)

Paid Search

Used for all paid search except Google

utm_campaign campaign_name

utm_medium cpc

utm source site name

Example:

http://mysite.com/? utm medium=cpc&utm source=bing&utm c ampaign=campaign_name

Email / Newsletter

Used for all email communication

utm_campaign campaign_name

utm_medium email

utm_source email_provider

Example:

http://mysite.com/? utm medium=email&utm source=email pr ovider&utm_campaign=campaign_name

Social (non-paid)

Used for all social posts

utm_campaign campaign_name

utm medium social

utm source social_site_name

Example:

http://mysite.com/? utm medium=social&utm source=facebo ok&utm_campaign=campaign_name

SMS

Used for all sms (i.e. text messages)

utm_campaign campaign_name

utm medium sms

utm source database_name

Example:

http://mysite.com/? utm medium=sms&utm source=customers&ut m campaign=campaign name

Other Sites / Ad Network

Used for advertising on third party websites

utm_campaign campaign_name

utm_medium display

utm source site name

Example:

http://mysite.com/? utm medium=display&utm source=intuit &utm campaign=campaign name

Deeper Granularity

If there's a need for greater granularity we can add a utm_content parameter

utm_content demographic, format/ content, segment

Example: professional, university, registered, prospect, male_30-35, etc.

Note: For paid advertising on social sites use utm_medium=paid_social
